FROM THE SECRETARY

We are slowly approaching 100 paid members! It has been exciting to meet our new members, many of whom are fairly new to the aviation world. I receive many questions regarding membership levels, so as a reminder, our levels are as follows:

Regular: Anyone who pays dues and is a current member of national EAA; afforded full voting rights and can hold

any elected or appointed position in the Chapter. (\$40)

Family: Any family that pays appropriate dues and are current family members of national EAA. Family members 18 or older are afforded full voting rights and can hold any elected or appointed position in the Chapter. (\$60)

Friends of EAA: Anyone who pays friends dues in support of Chapter activities. They shall have no voting rights nor hold any elected or appointed position in the Chapter and are not required to join national EAA. (\$25)

Student: Anyone who pays student dues. They shall have no voting rights nor hold any elected or appointed positions in the Chapter. They are not required to join national EAA. (\$10)

- Prior to the Young Eagles flight, ensure you meet all of the pilot requirements and follow the guidelines listed below
- 5. Complete a Young Eagles registration form before the flight, signed by you and a parent or legal guardian
